Dear Families,

This week we have been holding some Open Mornings specifically for Year 6 students who might have missed our Summer Open Evening. It's been lovely to meet these prospective future students and everyone has enjoyed teaching with their doors open to give our visitors a warm and friendly view of our school.

We held a planned Fire Drill during the week and created a new PB of 6 minutes, 47 seconds. This is the amount of time it takes to get the whole school out the buildings and on to the tennis courts. Next half term we will be running an unannounced fire drill, and in the spring term we will be conducting a mock Lock-Down procedure. We will be briefing students about that nearer the time.

While on the subject of safety, I would like to let you know that we are inviting our canine friends and the police back into school at some point this term to sweep for drugs. For obvious reasons we will not be informing anyone of the due date of the Drugs Dogs visit. If you have any suspicion that any person is attempting to sell your child drugs locally, or if you suspect that your child is taking drugs, please get in contact with us because we can make sure that other third-party agencies can support your child to stop. We will also liaise with the police when necessary to ensure that illegal possession, criminal sale or consumption is appropriately sanctioned.

We'd like to clarify matters on attendance. If your child has a medical appointment that needs time taken out of school, all that is needed is an email or note to the form tutor in advance of the appointment. If you are making a request for an absence for more complicated reasons, you will need to complete an absence request form (please see the school's website). This needs to be given to your child's head of year in advance of the date. If your child is absent when we do not have advance notice and we cannot contact you on the first day of absence, we will be telephoning and emailing until we obtain a response from you. All absences from school, where we have not been notified in advance, are followed up on the same morning with an email. If the email does not meet with a response, we then call you on the same morning. We do appreciate the help of families in supporting our efforts to ensure high levels of attendance, and are grateful to those who contact us with information in a timely way. High levels of attendance are known to be directly linked to excellent GCSE outcomes. Parental support for this is vital for all our young people.

Good luck in the week ahead to students who are going out to compete in the English Schools' Cross County Cup, Hampshire Book Awards "Meet the Author" event, and Sissi Herbert of Year 8, who will be competing in the National Equestrian Championships, (thanks to Miss Thomas for accompanying her). HM Lord-Lieutenant of Hampshire, Mr Nigel Atkinson and Mrs Atkinson will be coming to open Invictus building with Hampshire County Council members and officers in attendance. They will tour the school on Thursday morning. We are looking forward very much to welcoming the Lord-Lieutenant to Robert May's School and showing off all our new facilities.

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## FIRST AID ROOM


The first aid room is open daily during break-times for non-emergencies (for example, headaches, stomach aches or toothache).





## **CONTACTING THE SCHOOL**

Between 8.25am and 2.25pm our teachers, team leaders and tutors are teaching. If you need to get in contact over an academic or pastoral matter directly related to your child, the best way to begin is to email [info@rmays.com](mailto:info@rmays.com) and make sure that the name of the teacher you wish to contact is in the message heading. We hope you will appreciate that teachers will not be able to respond during the normal school day, but they will do their best to respond as soon as they can, once students have left the site and any relevant meetings and training sessions have taken place.

Funding for schools is now uncomfortably tight. Staffing has been cut over the last 3 years in order to try and maintain a prudent and balanced budget each year. This means that all staff in school are working to maximum capacity and are very time-constrained. Their main focus is always going to be the learning and well-being of the children and young people who are here. Teachers do not have time to deal with matters that cannot be resolved sensibly and calmly. We will not tolerate rudeness, threats or aggression of any kind from visiting adults. It is not appropriate, for example, to demand to meet with a member of staff without an appointment, or to remain on-site without an invitation. The school has powers to bar adults who behave unacceptably. All staff working at the school have the right to work in a safe and positive environment. They are expected to be good role models for our students. The same is expected of visiting adults and parents.

From time to time, and, thankfully, rarely, we might receive an aggressive email. This will be quarantined automatically by our system and sent back to the writer for re-wording. All staff have been directed not to answer emails between 5pm and 8am on weekdays, during weekends or designated holidays. This is in

compliance with the government's initiative to reduce teachers' workload and also to allow our staff to exercise their right to a family life.

Thank you for respecting our approach to direct and online communications.
