As mentioned last week, we will be installing tents in the front quad for the benefit of Year 9 so that they have more outdoor covered space. Tents will be delivered and put up during the break so that they are ready for our November return.

Staying with thoughts about winter and inclement weather, we would like to remind everyone that students will be needing to wear additional layers underneath their school uniforms in order to stay warm after the half term break. This can include t-shirts, sports warm-wear and/or thermal clothes. Currently the government's advice and guidance is that good ventilation has an important role to play in reducing the risks of Covid-19 spreading. As mentioned to you in earlier bulletins, we are worried about wasting the warmth from our heating system. At the same time, we can see that being able to keep classroom windows open, external doors propped open etc. to help the fresh air dispel droplets from people's breath aerosols is still going to be an important safety factor in the weeks ahead. So warm clothes and coats are going to be essential after the break.

Coats are allowed at Robert May's School! We have noticed a number of students coming into school without coats, and some who are wearing hoodies, denims or sweatshirts over their uniform. Hoodies, denims and sweatshirts have never been permitted on the school site, and so we are reaching out to all parents to ask that all students have a coat to wear into school from the start of next half-term. Ideally these should be a dark colour and should not carry any slogans or inappropriate phrases. Good examples can be found at major retailers online, ranging between £12.99 and £19.99. We accept that sports-style zipped fleece jackets can be worn in school instead of hoodies/denims/sweatshirts, please. RMS PTFA has the school's sports microfleece for sale and this also would be acceptable

As the daylight saving time changes (this coming weekend) and the nights draw in, we are reminded of the need to be vigilant about road safety and the potential for children and young people to fall into harm's way. There are some public safety announcements and road safety information pieces below on this matter.

Continuing with avoiding harm, there's not much likelihood of organised firework displays in the area this year because of restrictions. We are concerned that the absence of organised displays may mean that some young people might experiment with fireworks and hurt themselves. Please make sure you know where your children are and what they are doing if they are out with friends in the longer dark evenings ahead.

Black Lives Matter and Black History Month update: following on from correspondence with former students last term about reshaping the curriculum to include a better understanding of the evils of colonialisation, apartheid and modern day micro-aggressions (to name only a small number of key elements), we are reporting that the school library opened up a range of resources which have been tapped into by tutors and students (<https://sites.google.com/rmays.com/robertmayslibrary/home>). Students have given enthusiastic reports of the recommended books and uptake has been high. In History, Year 10 students have been learning about the Exodusters and their movement to Kansas in 1879 as they fled from the prejudice and discrimination that still existed in the Southern States of the USA after slavery had been abolished. This enabled further discussions about engrained racist attitudes and the ongoing struggle for equality. In addition, Year 7 students are working through a PSHCEE unit about diversity and inclusion in Britain today. Our curriculum content review is now underway and Mr Symonds-Keates is leading on this. We will report progress on this as the year progresses. In addition to all this, we would like to thank the parent who sent in further Diversity discussion resources from Reading University which have been shared with teachers and students.

Poppies: we will be planning to have a socially distanced and remote streaming of a wreath laying ceremony and Act of Remembrance on Armistice Day at 11.00am. The Royal British Legion has given us a box of poppies for each year group. Please would you consider supporting the Royal British Legion by allowing your child to bring in any cash donations for this wonderful organisation that supports former and current services families. Collections will start, by year group, in school, on 2nd November.

Finally, in all honesty, I did not dare to think that we would get this far through the term without some kind of major Covid-related issue and perhaps having to accept some kind of temporary closure. So the fact that we have been able to stay open continuously is, once again, down to everyone playing their part in being careful: watching out for symptoms, arranging for tests, self-isolating and thinking always about others' safety. Thank you to everyone who has shouldered any kind of responsibility in this- whether it has been checking that your child has their own face covering, looking after an isolated child, taking care to keep the household away from risks and threats as a matter of course, or travelling further than you could wish to obtain a test. All of this has helped, hugely.

Everyone here at RMS wishes you and your families a safe, peaceful and enjoyable break. We look forward to seeing your children again, if they are completely well, on Monday 2nd November, rested and refreshed, ready to continue enjoying their learning.

STUDENT SAFETY AND DARK NIGHTS

On Saturday night we will be setting the clocks back an hour and summer time ends. Road traffic collisions increase by 20% in the fortnight after the time change. Sadly, some of those collisions will involve child pedestrians and cyclists. Children under-16 are one of the most vulnerable groups of road users.

The latest available government statistics (2015)* show that 58% of children who die or are seriously injured in a road collision are involved in incidents between 3.00 - 7.00pm. From next Sunday, much of those will happen in darkness.

Whilst younger children are at risk, the data shows that 11-15 year olds are actually at more at risk from accidents that kill or result in serious injury.

Information regarding College Applications

Over the coming weeks, Year 11s will be applying for their post-16 courses. Students have received information about what to put in the part of the application where they are asked for 'predicted grades'. We are using target grades which can be found on the latest review. Students should put a grade that is between the National and RMS grade.

In this example, it would be sensible to put a grade 4 down as the target grade. If asked for different subjects, you can vary slightly depending on whether it is a strong or weak subject but for this student, the average should be a 4.

The deadline for students to write their personal statements was the end of September. This was to allow tutors to read through the statements before students send them off to colleges. Year 11s were given time in PSHEE to complete their personal statements but if they are not complete, they should speak to their tutor about reviewing it when they are completed. These statements are key to applying to colleges as they tell the colleges about students' strengths, interests and aspirations.

The interview process is different this year to fit around Covid guidance. Most colleges will be running telephone interviews between November and January. Once you have applied, you will be given the timetable and further information about the rest of the application process.

MEDICAL UPDATE

Flu jabs – Year 7 students

North Hampshire School Age Immunisation Team came into school on 2nd October to administer flu jabs to Year 7 students, providing a parental consent form had been completed.

Please note, there will not be a catch-up session in school for this.

Medication in School

We would like to remind you of our policy with regards to non-prescribed medication, which includes painkillers such as paracetamol. These will not be held by the school, nor will we administer painkillers to any student. If the first aider covering the First Aid Room, is placed in a position of being aware that a student wishes to take their own paracetamol, they will telephone a parent/carer to gain verbal permission and check that the student has not taken any other paracetamol containing products within the preceding 4 hours. Details of this call, including the time of the call and who gives permission, will be recorded in the First Aid Room log. A child under 16 years of age should never be given medicine containing aspirin unless prescribed by a doctor. Please note, first aiders will not be able to contact parents/carers regarding painkillers unless the student is able to provide the painkillers in the original packaging with clear expiry date and dose information.

We do not encourage students to bring their own medication into school and would ask that you are aware of what your child has in his/her school bag and keep any painkillers to a minimal amount. Please remind your child that they are not to share any of their medication with anyone else.
